Dear parents,

The word "framework plan" is sure to raise some questions for you. We would like to give you a brief summary here. We have already published the framework plan itself on Kitaweb following the parents' evening.

Why have we created a framework plan?

Together, we are a large daycare center and not only look after many children but also have large teams. The framework plan is intended to provide a "framework" for everyone to ensure that we work on a number of important topics with the children each year. For new employees in particular, it provides a quick overview of what we do throughout the year and thus provides a quick orientation.

Of course, we continue to focus on the children's interests in everyday life and other topics and projects can still be started in addition to the topics from the framework plan.



Tablet free time

Another project that was carried out for the first time at Woki is the tablet free time. The date chosen was in line with the fasting season, but the duration was shortened.

The project started on Ash Wednesday, March 5, 2025 and ending on March 31, 2025.

Together, we want to see this time as a small reset for us and the children and focus more on everyday life and the moments with the children. We all live in a world that is guided by media. Our children take it for granted that we can take photos at any time. We would like to go through a process together and consider what other options we have to save and document beautiful moments for ourselves.

For our daily work, this means finding new, creative ways together with the children. Even when we look back on the day, we need to find other solutions. We also need to find new ways of creating learning stories for the children's portfolios.

Following this time, we will reflect together in the teams and, if necessary, introduce changes to our daily routine with the children. We will keep you up to date on this.

We have been using our parent app as a means of communication for a few months now. We only send general information to you by message in the parent app and email contact is only for individual matters.


We would like to give you a brief update here and point out a few points. We can see in the app how many parents read our messages.




Messages via parent app:

Baked cauliflower thalers

- 1 small cauliflower
- 2 carrots
- 3 handfuls of grated cheese
- 2 eggs
- 1 tsp salt
- 2 tbsp breadcrumbs
- Spices to taste (paprika, curry, pepper, nutmeg)



- Peel the carrots and separate the cauliflower into florets.
- Shred both in a food processor. If you don't have a food processor, you can finely grate the carrots and cauliflower.
- Roast the carrot/cauliflower mixture in the oven at 200 degrees for approx. 10 minutes. Then mix everything together in a bowl. The mixture should not be too watery, add some breadcrumbs if necessary.
- Shape the mixture into pancakes and fry in a pan until golden yellow on both sides.
- They can also be baked in the oven at 180 200 degrees for approx. 15 - 20 minutes until they have a nice color.

Confetti cake:

- 300g Spelt flour type 630
- 1 packet baking powder
- 1 pinch of salt
- 200g soft butter
- 180g sugar
- 2 packet vanilla sugar
- 4 eggs room temperature
- 75ml milk room temperature

For the icing:

- 250g powder sugar
- 5 El lemon juice

Decoration:

- Colorful Sprinkles
- Confetti-Sprinkles
- **Smarties**

Mix the dry ingredients. Cream the butter and sugar until the butter is almost white... Gradually beat in the eggs. Add the flour mixture and milk and mix briefly

Pour the dough into a well-greased baking tray.

Bake the cake at 180°C top/bottom heat, 160-170°C fan oven for approx. 40 minutes (test with a skewer).

Parrot cake:

- 300g Spelt flour type 630
- 200g sof butter
- 180g sugar
- 4 eggs room temperature
- 1 packet vanilla sugar
- 1/4 Liter milk room temperature
- Food coloring



Beat the butter and sugar until very fluffy and almost white. Gradually add the eggs. Mix the flour with the baking powder and fold into the butter, sugar and egg mixture. Carefully stir in the milk.


Divide the dough into 4 portions and mix each with the colors.

Pour the colored dough into a well-greased baking tray in small blobs and bake at approx. 180 degrees top/bottom heat or 160-170 degrees convection heat for approx. 40 minutes. (stick test)

Finally, when the cake has cooled, you can decorate it as you wish, e.g. with icing and colorful sprinkles.

The actors came to our gym with their props and told an exciting story about an **egg that had a crack** in its shell and didn't feel as nice as the other eggs. Over time, the children learned that it was simply a special egg and that it wasn't the outside that mattered but the inside. The children listened to the story with rapt attention and were delighted that the story had a happy ending.

Hello dear parents,

Gina and I give you a little preview of our activities in the kindergartens and Foxies for the coming weeks. It's going to be exciting, fast, full of energy and sometimes wet... We started with a rollerblading course in March. Handling, rules, parking, steering, roller board construction (bus, mat trolley). All of this is important to us so that the children can use this material "in motion". And that's not ALL....





...because afterwards, the children can do a "fighting certificate" with us if they feel like it. Children often play very physically, fight in their role-playing games and sometimes compete in sports. And this is exactly where we would like to start. We use playful fighting activities to teach your children respectful, fair and gentle interaction. In addition to their own active actions, this also includes paying attention to the other person and accepting their actions (stop, hold, greeting, respect, winning, losing, motivation, fun) and adhering to rules.

The two certificates show the children what they have achieved! ... and (hopefully) remember later on how to use this material or role play.






And it continues to be so active...because another highlight is the **Kaya Run on 23.05.25**. We have once again been invited to take part in this charity run. We are taking you on board for this fast-paced event. The children will run a short (400m) and / or long (1000m) lap and you can motivate them and cheer them on. Detailed information about the Kaya Run will follow. Two short, motivating stories:... 2 years ago we took part. One pupil even exclaimed: "The little kids are faster than us."... 2 years ago it was an incredible experience, as the almost 60 children managed 150km together. Simply amazing!

And lastly:... This spring (we expect to start at the end of April) we also want to use the element of water in the swimming pool for our preschoolers (games and awareness in the water). You will be informed about this as soon as possible. ...and in addition to all this, the sports games and parcours and movement stations are still very popular. Just like the many wonderful activities in the gym, indoor playground or atrium for our nursery.






We learn to use a knife

In recent weeks, we have seen that the role-play area has aroused great interest among the children. They look after the dolls, provide the teachers with food and drink or doctor and examine the dolls and cuddly toys. That's why our cuddly toy hospital opened in February. The children were able to bring their favorite cuddly toy from home and examine it, and at the end they even received a certificate.





Role play in the crèche is of great importance for children's development. They not only promote creativity and imagination, but also social and emotional skills. By acting out everyday situations, the children learn to adopt different perspectives and develop empathy. Role-playing also strengthens language development, as children can try out new words and expressions.



Construction and fine motor skills







In the cold winter, we spend a lot of time in the Woki themed rooms. The children play with different play materials that interest them. Over the last few months, the children have developed a great interest in construction. Whether it's building a castle out of magnetic modules or creating a large tower out of small pieces of wood and building difficult 3D puzzles. The children need a lot of patience for this, as the work with the different materials does not always hold together so well and can fall over or break. The children had a lot of fun putting their ideas into practice and at the same time occasionally had failures and had to start all over again if what they had built was not stable enough.

Because their interest is so great, the children also worked with smaller materials and practiced their dexterity when making difficult pictures.












Climate project - offer from the "Lias Grube"



Since returning from the Christmas vacations, we have been focusing on the topics of **getting to and from school** in our weekly school preparation meetings.

We thought together about topics such as "Where do I live and which school will I go to?" The children were surprisingly precise about what their house or apartment looks like and where they live. Many families made a school route book at home together with their child. Beautiful works of art were created. The books will now accompany the children until the end of the kindergarten year and offer a wonderful opportunity to reflect on the way to school again and again and to engage in conversation with others.

The topic of the **school building and teaching** also took up a lot of space. Using a model, the children were able to get an idea of the building, all kinds of questions came up and so we were delighted that the principal of Carl Platz Primary School took the time to spend one morning answering our children's questions.

Police officer Stefan was back at the school for several weeks to teach the kids helpful tricks on the subject of school **road safety**, which they were then able to proudly present to their parents on the final day of the course.

Another course offering started at the end of February with the "Trau Dich was" course, which we were really looking forward to! Now is also the time for school enrollment. Trau Dich Was Course





Dear parents,

Once again this year, the "Trau Dich Was" course is taking place for our oldest children.

Under the motto "Courageous, self-confident and strong", the children will learn important tips and tricks to help them get through the school day. Caren, our course leader, always emphasizes how important it is to trust your own feelings.

The children start each day of the course by adjusting the self-made **emotional clock** to how they feel today. In this way, the children learn to "feel inside themselves", to recognize triggers for feelings and to verbalize their own feelings.

We also learn the importance of body language in the course. For example, we practise standing up straight and wide in role plays, not forgetting the power of the voice. Sometimes it helps to say things louder until they get through to the other person.

Caren also repeatedly sends an important signal: "If you are afraid or need help, you are never a tattletale, but a courageous helper". The course always ends with a newly learned starting sentence, such as "I'm okay the way I am." These short, concise sentences are internalized by the children in such a way that they are still totally present until the next lesson.

We are looking forward to more wonderful weeks of "Trau Dich Was / Dare to do something".

Nutrition Education



Hello dear parents,

There is exciting news about nutrition education again!

From our little explorers at Kindergarten:



Our children have been busy practicing how to cut safely with a knife! The preschool children even received a cool knife license from me!

And this is how the preschool children succeeded!

First of all, we realized how important it is to prepare our workstation well - the cutting board must always have a firm footing. To test this, we played a little game with the boards.

We also created a special place for the cutting utensils, which we affectionately called the "knife parking lot". The children were allowed to design it themselves and take it home to proudly show off what they had learned!

Here they learned about the correct tunnel grip, the claw grip and the peeler and also, how to use the finger guard skillfully.

The children have learned:

<u>Tunnelgrip:</u> One hand forms a tunnel while you cut safely from below with the other hand. (Always accompanied by an adult)

<u>Clawgrip:</u> Here, one hand is formed into a "claw" under the cutting guard to protect your fingers. The other hand is used to cut.

<u>Peeling:</u> The children hold the vegetable or fruit firmly and always peel away from the hand.

The children had great fun and some even dared to cut an onion. So, they became onion kings or onion queens! Of course, they all received their well-earned licenses.





Nutrition Education



From our little explorers from the nursery:

In House 1, we worked intensively on the topic of "knife handling". The children had the wonderful opportunity to learn how to use special crib knives made of wood correctly and safely. They learned how much pressure they should apply when cutting a banana in order to work precisely and safely. This exercise not only helped to develop their motor skills, but also boosted their confidence in using tools.





We also played with kneading sand, which the children had to fill into different shapes. They were then allowed to use a toy knife to smooth the surface completely. This playful approach made it easy for them to learn how to coat food in a fun way. It was wonderful to see how enthusiastic and creative the children were while developing their fine motor skills.

In House 2, we devoted ourselves intensively and with great pleasure to the exciting topic of "The five senses"! Our first stop was the sense of touch, which we paid a lot of attention to. The children had the great opportunity to experiment with a carefully designed ice landscape and gain real-life experience of cold and wet. They even got to see first-hand what happens if you hold the ice in your hand a little too long - a vivid demonstration of how ice and heat play together! After this exciting experience, I made the topic even more interesting by introducing special touch boxes in which different foods were waiting for them to recognize by touch. Whether they always got it right was a source of great excitement and curiosity!

Afterwards, we curiously explored the sense of smell. I brought along a creative smell memory that allowed the children to immerse themselves in the fascinating world of scents. After they had explored the different smells in detail, they were finally allowed to choose their personal favorite scent - a very special experience for many of them!





Finally, we turned our attention to our sense of taste with great curiosity. I had brought a colorful selection of different foods for the children to taste and explore with their tongues. From sweet and salty to bitter and sour, there was something for every taste, which made the experience particularly exciting for the children and stimulated their senses in numerous ways.

You can look forward to what I'll tell you next time about our little explorers...

Training area:

In recent months, all native speakers have been able to take part in a basic course on pedagogy. We had the speaker Mr. Moster as a guest.

We are also currently running a two-day workshop internally on the topic of parent-teacher conferences.

In December, the management team and some special positions took part in training by *Ben Furmann*, the inventor of the "I can do it" concept. In it, he describes a 15-step process in which children are empowered to find solutions to challenges and gradually implement them independently.

This promotes the children's ability to find solutions, leads to a strengthening of self-efficacy and, last but not least, to an increase in resilience factors.


Unfortunately, we also have to say goodbye. We wish them all the best for their future!
